INTRODUCTION:

And I will make of you a great nation; I will bless you, and make your name great, and you shall be a blessing. And I will bless those who bless you and curse him who curses you; and in you shall all families of the earth be blessed. So Abram departed, as the L-rd had spoken to him; and Lot went with him; and Abram was seventy five years old when he departed from Haran. And Abram took Sarai his wife, and Lot his brother's son, and all their possessions that they had gathered, and the souls that they had gotten in Haran; and they went forth to go to the land of Canaan; and to the land of Canaan they came. And Abram passed through the land to the place of Shechem, to the terebinth of Moreh. And the Canaanite was then in the land. And the Lrd appeared to Abram, and said, to your seed will I give this land; and there he built an altar to the L-rd, who appeared to him. G-d promised Abraham that although his descendants would go into exile and be enslaved, ultimately, He would free them, bring them to Israel, and make Israel the eternal homeland of Abraham's descendants, the Jewish people.

One of the oldest ever recorded purchases of land was the purchase of a burial site by Abraham for his wife Sarah. The Torah's account is replete with details that reflect the realities of acquisition and property transfer of that time.

Genesis 12:1-9

"Go for yourself, from your land, from your relatives and from your father's house to the land that I will show you. And I will make of you a great nation; I will bless you, and make your name great, and you shall be a blessing... And Abram took Sarai his wife, and Lot his brother's son, and all their possessions that they had gathered, and the souls that they had gotten in Haran; and they went forth to go to the land of Canaan; and to the land of Canaan they came..."

Abraham buried his wife, Sarah, in Hebron, in one of the earliest recorded purchases of land. Genesis 23

"Sarah died in Kiryat-Arba; which is Hebron in the land of Canaan; and Abraham came to mourn for Sarah, and to weep for her. And Abraham stood up from before his dead, and spoke to the Hittites, saying, I am a stranger and a sojourner with you; give me possession of a burying place with you, that I may bury my dead ...; and Abraham weighed Ephron the silver, which he had named in the hearing of the Hittites, four hundred shekels of silver, current money among the merchants. And the field of Ephron, which was in Machpelah, which was before Mamre, the field, and the cave which was in it, and all the trees that were in the field, that were in all the borders around, were made over to Abraham for a possession in the presence of the Hittites, before all who went in at the gate of his city."

Q: Are religious practices and laws linked to the land of Israel?

A: Many of the commandments of the Torah are directly related to a Jewish presence in Israel, and all are more deeply significant when performed in Israel.

Sefer HaChinuch, Author's Letter of Introduction

[There are a total of 613 commandments, mitzvot, in the Torah] However, the commandments that every Jew is commanded without circumstances creating a cause for it, are, two hundred and seventy. And the mnemonic is "I am sleeping, but my heart is awake" (er, the numerical equivalent of its letters being two hundred and seventy). [More than 50% of Biblical commandments require a Jewish presence in the land of Israel.]

Song of Songs 5:2

I was asleep, but my heart was awake.

Nachmanides, Commentary on Leviticus 18:25

For the main [fulfillment] of the commandments is [to be kept] when dwelling in the Land of G-d. Therefore, the Rabbis have said in the Sifre: "And ye shall possess it, and dwell therein. And ye shall observe to do all the statutes etc." Dwelling in the Land of Israel is of equal importance to all the commandments of the Torah.

Q: What are the unique qualities of Israel?

A: Israel has unique spiritual qualities that make the ideal land for prophecy and Torah.

Israel is the land of Divine Providence.

Deuteronomy 11:10-11

..... the land, which you are going over to possess, is a land of hills and valleys, and drinks water from the rain of the skies; A land which the L-rd your G-d cares for; the eyes of the L-rd your G-d are always upon it, from the beginning of the year to the end of the year.

Israel is the land of prophecy, inspiration, and Torah

Genesis 2:10-12

And a river went out from Eden to water the garden; and from there it was divided and became four rivers. The name of the first is Pishon; that is the one which flows around the whole land of Havilah, where there is gold; **And the gold of that land is good**....

Midrash Genesis Rabbah 16:5

"And the gold of that land is good" - this teaches us that there is no Torah like the Torah of the land of Israel, and there is no wisdom like the wisdom of the land of Israel.

Talmud, Bava Batra 158b

Rav Zeira said, "The air of the land of Israel bestows wisdom"

Rabbi Yehudah Halevi, Kuzari 2:16

Whoever prophesied did so either in the Holy Land, or concerning it, e.g. Abraham in order to reach it, Ezekiel and Daniel on account of it... These are, without doubt, the places worthy of being called the gates of heaven.

Maimonides, Mishneh Torah, Laws of Kings and Wars 5:10

Great sages would kiss the borders of the Land of Israel, kiss its stones, and roll in its dust. Similarly, Psalms 102:15 declares: "Behold, your servants hold her stones dear and cherish her dust."
